Call For Papers

- Innovative Models of Intervention;
- Facility Planning and Design;
- Prisoner and Staff Safety;
- Staff Training;
- Prisoner Management;
- Correctional Leadership;
- Corrections Experience in Post-Conflict Situations;
- Community Corrections / Probation and Parole; and
- Care and Custody of Prisoners with Mental Health Needs

Presentations should offer creative views of anticipated changes in trends, technologies, operational practices, and system responses to managing diverse prisoner populations. Guidelines and a proforma for submitting abstract proposals can be found at www.icpa.ca.

The format of the conference is a mixture of plenary sessions and workshops. The time allocation for workshop papers is 45 minutes. We welcome presentations in either English or Spanish. Barbados Prison Service

The Barbados Prison Service is responsible for all security, the general well being, and rehabilitation of inmates. The Prison Department falls under the responsibility of the Ministry of Home Affairs of Barbados.

The Barbados Prison Service manages one prison facility, namely Her Majesty's Prisons Dodds. The prison is a purpose built mixed category institution with a housing capacity of 1,250 inmates - 1,150 males and 100 females. HMP Dodds is a new facility, built after the burning of Glendairy Prison in March of 2005 and was officially opened on the 15th October, 2007. At present the population averages about 965 males and 33 females housed in minimum, medium, maximum and remand (pre-trial) housing. The Prison is for inmates from the age 16 and has a staff compliment of 432.

Bridgetown

The most easterly of the Caribbean Islands, Barbados is a coral island surrounded by the glistening turquoise sea. Called "the Gem of the Caribbean," Barbados is an inspired choice for conventions and meetings. It is a setting where an awe-inspiring coastline, perfect temperatures, and the friendliest people in the world come together.

Bridgetown is the capital and largest city of the nation of Barbados. The City of Bridgetown, and the wider Greater Bridgetown area occupy most of the parish of Saint Michael, an area which covers around 39km² (15 sq. mi). Parts of the Greater Bridgetown area lie along the borders of the neighbouring parishes Christ Church and St. James.

Bridgetown serves as a principal centre of commercial activity in Barbados, as well as a central hub for the island's public transport system. Many of the ministries and departments of the island's government are located within the Greater Bridgetown area.
